MMCM Michael J Waranis began his naval service with Recruit Training at Orlando, Florida in January of 1990. Following MM "A" School in Orlando, Florida, he was assigned to the USS Nassau (LHA-4). MMCM Waranis' subsequent tours included USS John F. Kennedy (CV-67), United States Naval Academy, and Assault Craft Unit Four.

MMCM Waranis has served as Steam Propulsion Engineer on board USS NASSAU (LHA-4). In addition MMCM Waranis served on USS JOHN F KENNEDY (CV-67) as a liquid oxygen and liquid nitrogen plan operator. MMCM Waranis also served at the United States Naval Academy as an instructor at Rickover Hall in addition he was an Officer in Charge of a
