Commander Morrison is a Magna Cum Laude graduate of Strayer University earning a Bachelor of Science degree in Business Administration. She joined the United States Navy in June 1985 and was commissioned a Limited Duty Officer-Administration, July 2000.

She successfully completed sea duty tours at U.S. Naval Forces Central Command/U.S. FIFTH Fleet/Combined Maritime Forces as a Flag Secretary/Staff Executive Officer from June 2012 - May 2014 and Naval Special Warfare Unit THREE as Administrative Officer/Department Head from June 2004 - June 2005 supporting OPERATIONS IRAQI FREEDOM and ENDURING FREEDOM. Additionally, served aboard Precommissioning Unit/USS Ronald Reagan (CVN-76) from May 2002 - June 2004 as Flag Secretary and Personnel Officer planning and coordinating the Commissioning Ceremony and crew homeport change to San Diego, California.

Commander Morrison's shore duty assignment are: Officer in Charge, Personnel Support Activity Detachment, Fort Meade, Maryland from October 2009 - June 2012 serving more than 4,000 U.S. Navy Personnel stationed at U.S. TENTH Fleet, Navy Information Operations Command, Fort Meade, Navy Operational Support Center, Baltimore, U.S. Naval Academy, and various shore and sea duty components in northern Maryland and overseas locations. As the Flag Officer Aide-Flag Secretary, She worked in the Office of the Vice Chief of Naval Operations from July 2005 - September 2009 under the leadership of three Vice Chiefs of Naval Operations.

Her most recent tour is Deputy Chief of Naval Operations for Operations, Plans and Strategy (N3/N5) Flag Secretary from June 2014 - August 2015. She reported to Space and Naval Warfare Systems Command, Space Field Activity, Chantilly, Virginia in September 2015 and currently serves as the Executive Officer.
