

ATHENS ACCESS/UP TO DATE CME INSTRUCTIONS

Please read below about how to obtain Athens Access, which will allow you to access Up to Date via the web/Athens, as well will allow you to earn CME credit for reading Up To Date articles. Every time you look at an Up to Date article, you can earn 0.5 CME credits. This adds up fast and should be another resource for you to earn CME/CEU.

When you register for Athens, do NOT associate with the NCMSD library if you have a navy.mil email address (as NCMSD Athens access requires a med.navy.mil email address to register for Athens via the web) - you must select "Navy Medicine Electronic Library" as your library per the instructions below.

Once you obtain Athens access, follow these simple steps to access Up To Date and earn CME.

- 1) After logging in, click on "Resources."
- 2) Scroll down and click on the Up To Date link.
- 3) Register your Up to Date account.
- 4) Then Click On CME to register for AMA PRA Category 1 Credit.
- 5) Now every time you search a topic in Up to Date and spend some time on that topic, you should receive .5 CME credit.
- 6) To 'earn' a certificate, click on the CME link and then the current month link (ex. February), and click on the links about how you used the UTD article to help manage your pts (takes a few seconds), then click save and you can then print CME certs.
- 7) You can print CME certs off by clicking on the CME link.

Note: For GMO's - review your state/board licensing CME requirements to see if there is a limit to how many of this type of CME you are allowed to use towards state licensing requirements - ex. AAFP may limit Up to Date CME types to 20 per year.

3) Once you complete the self-registration process the system will send you an email from athens@bianca.eduserv.org.uk

<<mailto:athens@bianca.eduserv.org.uk>> with a link to allow you to create a

password for use with the system. You must activate your account by using the link included in the email that you will receive.

-If you have any issues with using the self-registration process send me an email with your information and medical specialty/position and I will create an account for you.

If you do not receive the email, please check your junk email folder.

Please contact me to have the system resend it.
