

The **Military Working Dog Trainer/Kennel Master (DL)** Course is designed as a prerequisite to the in-resident Kennel Master/Trainer course. This course contains one block of instruction. It covers Kennel Master and trainer responsibilities, Ground Combat, Crisis Response and Limited Contingency Operations. Also covered are distinctions between Specialized Search Dogs and Combat Tracker Dogs. Students are required to meet all parameters of this course as well as pass the end of block test which will be conducted by the students local Base Education Office. Approved Test Proctors are also authorized in the event an Education Office is not available.

In order to attend the in-resident KM course, students must complete this DL course. Students arriving to take the in-resident course without completing the KM DL course, will be sent back to their home unit. Students can also use the above email address for any questions on the course.

#### **REQUIREMENTS TO TAKE COURSE:**

1. Must be in AFSC 3P0X1A, Sister Service equivalent, DoD hired, or international student. (AFSAT)
2. Must also be a graduate of the MWD Handler Course; this requirement cannot be waived.
3. Must have a minimum of 18 months of experience in the MWD Program.
4. Must be in the grade of SrA (E-4) through CMSgt (E-9) for all military personnel.
5. Must hold the position of Kennel Master or MWD trainer.
6. A Secret security clearance or NACLIC is required to attend this course. All AF security clearance or investigative requirements will be coordinated with the MAJCOM Information Protection Office.

#### **HOW TO REGISTER IN ADLS:**

Initial ADLS registration must be done from a ".mil" account without CAC log-in. Also if a student has ever registered for an ADLS account (from the inception of ADLS in 2006) their profile is still on the server and can be updated. Once the account registration is validated and your certificates are loaded the student you can access ADLS from a ".com" and link their CAC.

- a. Ensure you are using Microsoft Internet Explorer 2.  
You can only register from Non-secure Internet Protocol (IP) Router Network (NIPRNet) known as a ".mil" or military network 3. Make sure you go to ADLS directly at:

- Do not login via AF Portal or with CAC. Do not use e-mail links or access ADLS from a Google or Yahoo search.  
- After entering your SSN, Last Name and DOB click Submit. (When creating your profile, enter items marked with an \* for now.)
- b. After your ADLS account has been verified/validated you can ACCESS: AETC, AFCEC, AU, AMC and Go Learn, from a Commercial Internet Service Provider with your Common Access Card (CAC).

If you are experiencing sever accessibility issues you might need to contact your Computer Support Professional to ensure your PC complies with the USAF SDC (Standard Desktop Configuration) so all ADLS CBT's can run properly. The ADLS and some of the courses may not display properly if the appropriate software is not installed on your computer. The following items provide an extensive system check. Ensure that you have Adobe Flash Player 23 PPAPI & Active X and Adobe Flash Player Plug In. Microsoft Explorer 9 & 10 has issues with some of our CBT's (version 8 & 11 seem to work best).

#### Troubleshooting Techniques:

1. Right-click the "Gear" icon at the top-right of your browser window
2. Verify that "Menu Bar" is checked
3. If not, click "Menu Bar." You should now have menu buttons in the top- left of your browser window.
4. Click the "Tools" menu button at the top-left of Internet Explorer (or hit Alt-T)
5. In this menu, click "Internet Options"
6. In the "Internet Options" window, click the "Delete..." button under "Browsing History"
7. Verify that "Temporary Internet Files" and "Cookies" each have checkmarks beside them.
8. If not, click the boxes to check them off.
9. Click the "Delete" button
10. In your "Internet Options" window, click the "Content" tab
11. Under "Certificates," click "Clear SSL State"
12. Click the "OK" button
13. Click the "OK" button in the "Internet Options" window
14. Click the "Tools" menu button at the top-left of Internet Explorer (or hit Alt-T)
15. Click "Compatibility View Settings"
16. Verify that "af.mil" is in the second white box
17. If not, type "af.mil" (no quotes) in the first white box and click the "Add" button
18. Verify that "af.mil" is in the second white box
19. Verify that "Display intranet sites in Compatibility View" is checked
20. Click the "Close" button
21. Click the "Tools" menu button at the top-left of Internet Explorer (or hit Alt-T)
22. Hover over "Pop-up Blocker" and click "Turn off Pop-up Blocker"
23. Close all of your Internet Explorer windows
24. Open Internet Explorer, and try to load the problematic page or course again
